Founded in 1976, the Enfield Community Council is a not-for-profit 501 (C) 3 corporation formed under the State of New York. The purpose of the organization shall be to promote the welfare of the community by giving greater efficiency to existing organizations through mutual cooperation and coordination, and when necessary, by sponsoring new activities.

2015 PROGRAMS

YOUTH PROGRAMS - ECC in collaboration with Cornell Cooperative Extension of Tompkins County offered a variety of activities to approximately 32 Enfield youth from ages 8-16 years old. Programs ranged from Primitive Pursuits, Summer Camp Counselor-In-Training program, youth employment, Girls Circle and Girl Ventures, Enfield Sugar Makers, Magic Mondays, Walking Wednesdays, Finally Fridays, Midday Mentoring, Mad Science and Mythbusting, homework help, Iron Chef, Awesome Animals, and various camping opportunities. Youth also visited the Cayuga Nature Center, The Finger Lakes Land Trust Stevenson Forest Preserve, and the Cornell Museum of Glass. They also helped set up and run the Harvest Festival. Youth learned social skills, conflict resolution, teamwork, sportsmanship, decision-making, problem solving, self-esteem, empowerment, and leadership through these after school and additional programs.

YOUTH BASKETBALL - Last winter, thirty eight 3rd, 4th and 5th grade boys and girls participated in basketball games with other elementary schools in the ICSD. Strong coaches volunteered and the children learned teamwork, good sportsmanship and skill building through this program.

SUMMER CAMP - Our 6-week summer camp was held at Treman Park - the best site ever - because we're on vacation! 98 campers, including 10 CIT's attended. Before and after camp care was available. Programs included nature, sports, arts, science, and creek exploring and swimming in the afternoon. There was also Primitive Pursuits offered twice a week and Wednesday Walkers. Many field trips and special theme days added to the fun.

QUILTING GROUP - Two Enfield women assembled the stunning queen-sized 2015 quilt that was raffled at the 40th Annual Harvest Festival. The quilt was finished in a quilt-as-you-sew pattern.

NEWSLETTER - ECC published three issues of the *Enfield Community Currents* in January, April, and September. This publication provides the community with town news, community updates and activity schedules. It was mailed to 1,000 homes.


ENFIELD COUNTRY FAIRE - ECC organized and held their third annual spring Country Faire on May 10th at the Enfield Elementary School. A pig roast was a main attraction along with music, games, information booths, and vendors.

HARVEST FESTIVAL - This October event is ECC's major fundraiser each year, with all proceeds used to provide youth programs. In addition to the traditional events of children's games, a quilt raffle, chicken BBQ, silent auction and the aerial ping pong drop, we had the Enfield Fire Department, a State Trooper texting and driving demonstration, equipment from the Highway Department, information and vendor booths. The theme was "Working Together As A Community" and the sunny weather made it a big success.

COMMUNITY YARD SALE - An August community event was area-wide with a map showing individual sales. Many people in the community participated.

NEW COMMUNITY BUILDING - The building committee continues to meet to move forward with the many steps in the process of building and funding the new building. It will house community events, youth activities and support, rental activities, a commercial kitchen, and expanded organizational activities.
