

Report from the Supervisor

The Town Board is off to a busy start in 2016.

Early this year the Black Oak Wind Farm decided to explore alternate locations for two turbines and the substation of the proposed wind farm. This has necessitated them to prepare a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement for the modified project to address the environmental impacts of the re-sited turbines. We are now in the middle of a 30 day comment period during which interested agencies can comment, as well as holding a public hearing scheduled for March 28 at the Enfield Elementary School, 20 Enfield Main Rd. starting at 7 PM. People can also send written comments to the Board at 168 Enfield Main Rd., Ithaca, NY. After this comment period which ends April 12, the Town Board will vote on the completeness of the modified Environmental Statement and decide whether the Project can move forward. To add some interest, the Town of Newfield is now involved as one of the changes involves placement on a property in the Town of Newfield. This rather large (400+pages) document can be viewed at the Town Hall during regular office hours and can be viewed on the web at www.blackoakwindny.com.

Several months ago, I was told that the Town had no flag policy. I was initially surprised by this as I thought we were part of the United States of America and therefore covered by the U.S. Flag Code. After I came back from the Annual Meetings of Towns in mid-February and saw that our flag was not at half staff (Antonin Scalia, Supreme Court Justice had just died), I looked into this further. Indeed, there is a U.S. Flag Code (United States Code Title 4, Chapter 1 – The Flag). It would seem to me that this would be the policy that applies to our Town. However, passing a Flag Policy would be the easy part. Carrying out the Flag Policy would get into some serious time commitment by someone. It is obviously not in any current Town employee's job description (and we have very few Town employees) so it would seem that this task would have to fall to Town volunteers. There are currently 2 Town flags; one at the Town Hall and one at the Highway building. This would mainly involve lowering the flag to half-staff on the following days:
May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (unless it is the third Saturday in May, Armed Forces Day then full-staff

- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day (until noon)
- July 27: National Korean War Veterans Armistice Day
- September 11, Patriot Day
- First Sunday in October: Start of Fire Prevention Week, in honor of the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service.
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day
- For 30 days: Death of a president or former president
- For 10 days: Death of a vice president, Supreme Court chief justice/retired chief justice, or speaker of the House of Representatives.
- From death until the day of interment: Supreme Court associate justice, member of the Cabinet, former vice president, president *pro tempore* of

the Senate, or the majority and minority leaders of the Senate and House of Representatives. Also for federal facilities within a state or territory,

for the governor.

On the day after the death: Senators, members of Congress, territorial delegates or the resident commissioner of the commonwealth of Puerto Rico. Contact me if you or your family (might be a good family project) are interested. We will get the light on the Town Hall flag pole operational when we paint the Town Hall this spring. And thank you, Jack Hubbell, for your long time commitment to providing the Town the flags that we fly. Thank you!

The Park & Ride is almost done.

Spring has sprung and the lengthening days are welcomed.

From the Code Enforcement Office

2015 was a busy year for the town with building and also solar installations. We had a total of eight new homes, conventionally built as well as doublewides and modular's on basements. There were also three mobile homes replaced with newer models on new foundations. We also had 23 solar installations: mostly roof mounted with a couple of ground mounted, and one " solar farm" located on Mecklenburg Road. This is a newer concept where people who don't have enough land or a sunny location such as a wooded lot or a home that doesn't have a south facing roof can buy into a solar farm where they own panels on leased land. This one will serve approximately 23 households around the county. This may be the way of the future as there are already plans for a larger farm also to be located in Enfield.

Enfield Volunteer Fire Company 2015 Call Responses

We had a total of 326 calls: 19 fires of various types, 187 EMS calls, 20 MVAs, 8 hazardous condition calls, 42 service calls, 32 mutual aid calls, 12 good intent calls, 4 false alarms, and 2 severe weather calls. Thanks to all of our members for their hard work last year.

From the Highway Superintendent

Spring is around the corner again. With the mild weather we have already been able to start the winter clean up. Cleaning up the shoulders of the road from plow damage, cutting trees, digging ditches. When the temperatures freeze and thaw like they did this winter, it brings havoc to the road surfaces. So you will see us out filling pot holes and cleaning things up.

Main summer projects will be South Buck Hill Rd between Enfield Center and Harvey Hill Rd, South Van Dorn Rd between Enfield Center and Bostwick Rd, and Fish Rd between Black Oak and Buck Hill Rd.

We have Cross over and Culvert pipes on several roads that we know of already that are in the need of repair.

In reference of the Town Board Minutes, Feb 10, 2016 under old business Ann Rider town supervisor stated "A substantial amount was in the 2016 budget for Highway replacement vehicles and repairs, in addition to adding funds for a new code vehicle". This is not what actually happened because the 2016 Highway budget was \$10,000 less than the 2015 budget. If you take a look at the 2016 Budget (available at the Town Hall) you will see that the increase to the 2016 budget came from the General Fund.

Rabies Clinic will be held at the New Highway Building 475 Enfield Main Rd. tentative date May 12, 2016. Fill and wood chips will be available if we are working in your area. Please call the Highway to put your name on the list. As always....see you on the roads!

Doctor Humphrey (Fact or Fiction) Sue Thompson Enfield Town Historian

On August 12, 1977, a young man was driving on Trumbulls Corners Road in Enfield when he saw a man standing on the side of the road with a small black bag in his hands. He stopped and asked him whether he wanted a lift. The man got in the front seat of the car. At this point the young man could see that the black bag was a doctor's medicine bag. He asked the doctor who he was and where he was going but the he never said a word. When they got near the intersection of Rumsey Hill and Trumbulls Corner roads, the doctor motioned for the young man to stop. The Doctor got out. The young man then reported that the doctor just disappeared. But when he glanced at the seat where he had been sitting there sat a bottle of Humphreys Witch Hazel Oil. The young man, now older of course, still has the bottle and tells this story over and over again.

True Facts On the 24th day of December 1923, Louis C. Leonard of Enfield, N.Y. became Louis F.L. Humphrey. Louis was born April 27, 1887, the son of Carrie Rumsey and Parker Leonard, Rumsey Hill Road. When Louis was thirty-six years of age he made the decision to change his name. According to hearsay, Louis was quite "taken" with Dr. Frederick Humphrey's patent medicines of the day (Humphreys Witch Hazel Oil) and this may have contributed to his choice of name. The fact that he chose the initials "F.L." with his new name would indicate this might well have been among his reasons.

The rest of the story... Alan Chaffee, Newfield Town Historian, recently shared items regarding Louis. One was a Veterinary Manual, Humphrey's Veterinary Specifics "for every living thing on the farm". Humphrey's Homeo. Med. Co. New York. Louis had written his name in the book – Louis F. L. Humphreys – May 6, 1914. There were prescription notes on treating horses with colic with Wild Yams/china Root) dosage was 5 to 60 drops page 249 Blackwoods materia medica. "Anson Nobles (was at Art Kelsey's) and a man at the blacksmiths over to Mecklenburg said it worked". Mr. Charley Dolloway a horse "Traider" that lives in Mecklenburg uses it also. Louis made note that he and Carrie Rumsey got some and tried it on Startle but it didn't work at all. There were papers also questioning the date of his birth. He stated he was 23 years old on April 27, 1912. He noted he needed to check with the school to confirm this date. A report to E.W. Updike school commissioner District No. 10 (Nobles School House) town of Enfield term commencing September 12, 1904. Pupils Mark Rumsey; Ralph Rumsey; Lester Holly; Walter Whitney; Clarence Curry; Harry Leonard; Randall Goldsmith; Louis Leonard; Elvira Holly. Written on this report was Louis F.L. Humphrey's 15 yrs old April 27, 1904; 45 years old April 27, 1935.


