

Petition to Impose a 90-Day Moratorium Prior to Approving a Wind Energy Permit to the Black Oak Wind Farm pursuant to the Town of Enfield's Wind Energy Law

Petition summary and background

Black Oak Wind Farm has proposed to build a wind farm on the Connecticut Hill area of the Town of Enfield. The original project layout, reviewed by the Enfield Town Board in January 2015 was for seven 1.7 megawatt ("MW") turbines with a total rated capacity of 11.9 MW. In July 2015, the Town Board approved modifications to the project including an increase to the height of each turbine by eight feet, and an increase to the rated capacity of each turbine to 2.3 MW with a total rated capacity for the facility of 16.1 MW. The Town Board also authorized certain changes to the location of the proposed interconnection substation. The Town Board approved these changes without reopening the SEQRA process. In February 2016, Black Oak Wind Farm filed a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement ("SEIS") proposing further significant modifications to the project as a result of certain disputes with landowners. During a public comment period which ended on April 22, 2016 and which included two public hearings, the public submitted over 400 pages of public comments. Despite efforts by the Town Board to begin the review process, Black Oak Wind Farm has delayed and refused to begin the process of responding to the comments.

On September 9, 2016, Black Oak Wind Farm sent around a blast email to its supporters informing them that the Enfield Town Board was going to finalize a number of documents at the upcoming September 14, 2016 Regular Town Board meeting and asking them to attend to support the project. Most of the Town Board members were not made aware of that agenda until after that email was sent around by Black Oak to its supporters. Furthermore, residents of Enfield received less than 24 hours notice of that agenda. THE PROCESS SURROUNDING THE BLACK OAK WIND FARM HAS NOT BEEN TRANSPARENT.

At the September 14, 2016 Town Board Meeting, Black Oak Wind Farm indicated that they intended to withdraw this SEIS and instead proceed with the original layout for the project as initially reviewed by the Town Board in January 2015 and as further amended in July 2015.

At this same meeting, after much debate, the Town Board agreed to defer consideration of the agreements and plans submitted by Black Oak Wind Farm for final vote until the October 12, 2016 Town Board meeting. The stated purpose for such delay was to allow additional time for the the Board and town residents to review these documents since Board members had only recently received such documents and they were made available for public review with less than 24 hours notice. The Board also wanted to give Black Oak Wind Farm sufficient time to reimburse the town for its expenses before that meeting (see below).

On September 21, 2016, a resident of Enfield was informed by an Ithaca Voice reporter that Black Oak Wind Farm had told him that, despite the Board's resolution to the contrary, there was going to be Special Town Board meeting held on September 28th to continue discussions on the documents submitted by Black Oak Wind Farm at the September 14th meeting. The resident then checked with the Town Clerk and various Town Board members, all of whom were unaware of any such meeting. Shortly thereafter, following an inquiry from the Town Clerk, the Town Supervisor, Ann Rider, posted a notice for a Special Town Board meeting on September 28th. The agenda indicates that various of the same documents

discussed and tabled at the September 14th meeting would be on the agenda for the September 28th meeting. ONCE AGAIN, BLACK OAK WIND FARM KNOWS ABOUT AN UPCOMING MEETING AND THE AGENDA BEFORE THE MAJORITY OF BOARD MEMBERS OR ANY TOWN RESIDENTS. FURTHERMORE, THIS MEETING IS CONTRARY TO THE WISHES OF THE MAJORITY OF THE BOARD WHO VOTED TO DEFER ANY SUCH DISCUSSION UNTIL THE REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING ON OCTOBER 12TH.

Black Oak Wind Farm is obligated to establish a \$15,000 Escrow Fund to be used to reimburse the Town of Enfield for reasonable expenses incurred by the Town in order to issue a Wind Energy Permit to Black Oak Wind Farm pursuant to its Wind Energy Law. Under that agreement, Black Oak must restore the Escrow Fund to the \$15,000 balance whenever the balance drops below \$2,000 and the town demands such payment. As of August 31, 2016, the Black Oak still hadn't reimbursed the town for \$31,758.67 of expenses. At the September 14, 2016 Town Board meeting, the Board indicated that an additional \$11,000 or so has accrued since that date. At this same meeting, Marguerite Wells, the Project Manager for Black Oak Wind Farm, stated that they lacked the funds to pay the amounts due and owing at this time. THE BOARD SHOULD DEFER ANY FURTHER CONSIDERATION OF THE WIND FARM UNTIL BLACK OAK WIND FARM BRINGS THE ESCROW FUND CURRENT.

Action petitioned for

We, the undersigned, are concerned citizens who urge our leaders to act now, prior to the issuance of any further permits or approvals to the Black Oak Wind Farm, to adopt a moratorium of 90 days on the issuance of a Wind Energy Permit pursuant to the Town of Enfield Local Law Number 1 of 2009, Wind Energy Facilities Local Law. Such moratorium would be used to (a) allow Black Oak Wind Farm to withdraw its Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement dated February 2016, (b) provide time for Black Oak Wind Farm to submit all remaining required documentation, in draft form, in connection with its original proposal for the wind farm project that was the subject of Enfield Town Board Resolutions in January 2015, as amended in July 2015, (c) allow Black Oak Wind Farm to pay the fees it owes the Town of Enfield pursuant to the Developer's Agreement, and (d) allow the citizens of Enfield and the members of the Enfield Town Board sufficient time to review and comment on the documentation outlined in clause (b) above.

Furthermore, we, the undersigned, urge our leaders to provide an automatic extension of the moratorium in the event Black Oak Wind Farm submits such documentation to the Enfield Town Board on a date that is later than 30 days following the first day of such moratorium period or fails to pay its fees in full by the end of the moratorium period. If Black Oak Wind Farm submits documents after the 30-day period the moratorium should be extended one additional day for each day beyond such 30 day period that it takes Black Oak Wind Farm to submit the complete package of remaining documentation referenced in clause (b) above. In addition, if Black Oak Wind Farm has failed to pay its fees in full by the end of the moratorium period, the moratorium should be further extended until they are paid in full.
