

Enfield Volunteer Fire Company built this fire hall in 1948-49 and expanded to the back in 1957. It is concrete-cinder block with a stepped facade on either end of a rounded roof. In 1971 it was expanded again to the south. It has two stories with the eastern entrance on the first level and the western on the second. When it was a fire hall, it had three garage doors on the east side. Upstairs was a large meeting room with a kitchen at the west end. The interior staircase runs up the north wall. In 1981 the Fire House was dedicated in memory of the late Harry Willis, a long time Enfield fireman and supporter. In 1988 the fire company sold the building to the Town of Enfield. The building is now the Community Building/Court/Code Enforcement Office.
