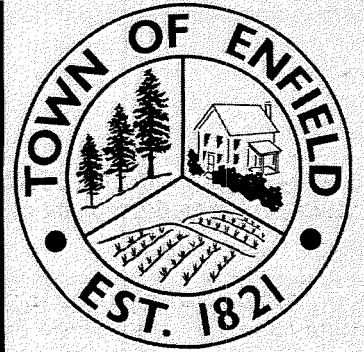

Report from the Supervisor

The Enfield Town Board is finishing a very busy year.

Early in the year, it came to my attention that Enfield has never allowed disabled, low income property owners to have a partial exemption for property taxes. Low income seniors have been able to apply for a partial exemption for many, many years. In addition, the income scale had not been reviewed in many, many years. After some research and a presentation by the very knowledgeable head of our County Assessment Department, Jay Franklin, the Town Board passed an updated Local Law "Senior and Disabled Citizens' Real Property Partial Tax Exemptions". Our new law allows property owners who are senior citizens (65 or older) or disabled property owners who meet income guidelines to have some relief from their property taxes. If your household's income is between \$24,000 and \$32,399 and all the property owners are over 65, or you feel you are legally disabled property owner, you should fill out an application at the County Assessment Office, 128 E. Buffalo St., Ithaca, NY. You will need to show proof of age, income and/or disability so you should call - **274-5517** - before making the trip, so you have a better chance of taking all the papers needed. I'm pretty sure this has to be a face to face interview.

The Town Hall has received a fresh coat(s) of paint, the soffits have been repaired, the light on the flag is operational, the windows are fixed, and the overhead doors have been repaired. Many, many thanks to the Wright Bros. of Searsburg and our own Norm Smith for doing this. They were both joys to work with and I can't thank them enough for making this Public Works Project (you don't want to know the amount of paperwork involved in this) go so smoothly!

The Black Oak Wind Farm has recently submitted many of the plans that are needed to complete the SEQRA process and the final permitting procedure on this large and complicated project. These plans have been forwarded to our Environmental Engineer for review and her opinion on the completeness of these plans or suggestions on how to better complete these plans. After the Board reviews these documents and our Environmental Engineer's recommendations, votes will be taken on each plan. Yes, it has been a long time. Yes, it seems never ending. But this is a very big project and there are many technical aspects to it and the Board has a responsibility to review the documents and ensure the reasonable safety of all residents of the Town.

On another renewable energy front.....Renovous has completed 2 solar farms on Mecklenburg Rd. They are starting a third. Delaware River Solar is in the process of submitting plans to the Enfield Planning Board for a large solar farm on Aiken and Podunk Rd. This will require a SEQRA so, will be a bit more complex.

The Wind Farm Advisory Committee has submitted its final report to the Board. They have made several recommendations to change the current Wind Farm Law in view of more current information regarding safety. The Board will be reviewing these recommendations in the upcoming months and will consider updating our current Wind Farm Local Law. Changes to this law would not affect the current project before the Board. Many thanks to the members of this committee for their hours of research, meeting time and data entry. The entire

From the Code Enforcement Officer

At the writing of this the town has issued a total of 69 building permits, including 5 new homes and 11 solar installations. This is down a little from last year when we issued a total of 79 permits including 10 new homes and 22 solar permits. Overall the amount of permits seems to stay about the same from year to year with the biggest change being the increase in solar installations over the last three years with a total of 55 solar installations including the solar farms located on Mecklenburg Road. Another topic I like to bring up this time of year is heating systems. Although we are already well into the heating season, if you haven't already you should have your heating system inspected/serviced. This should be done annually for all systems and more frequently if you are heating with a solid fuel including wood, coal or pellets. Lastly I like to remind folks to check their smoke and CO detectors for proper operation and fresh batteries if needed. I believe soon the only detectors available under the new building code will come with a ten year non replaceable battery, which eliminates the need to change batteries, but will also mean that after the ten

Flu Vaccinations Available at the Tompkins County Health Department

Protect yourself and your community from the flu and get vaccinated! There are many opportunities for flu vaccination including health care provider offices, pharmacies, and the Tompkins County Health Department. Everyone over the age of six months should be vaccinated every year against the flu.

Flu vaccination is the best protection against the flu – it protects you and limits the spread of flu to others. These include infants under the age of 6 months who are too young to be immunized and those who are immunocompromised such as people who are receiving cancer treatment.

Tompkins County Health Department (TCHD) is providing flu vaccinations at its location at **55 Brown Road** – across from the airport. There is plenty of free parking. Flu vaccinations will be available at the Health Department beginning, **October 6**. Appointments are necessary for all clinics and can be made by calling the Health Department at **607-274-6616**.

Flu vaccinations will also be available to the public on Tuesday, **October 13** from **9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at Lifelong**, 119 West Court Street. Call TCHD at 274-6616 to make an appointment.

"Illuminating", "Instructive", "Helpful", & "Fun"

These are some of the words participants have used to describe the volunteer Energy Navigator program, whose second round of training begins in March 2017. Volunteer Energy Navigators from all over Tompkins County learn to reduce their own energy use and save money, and help other community members do the same.

Volunteers complete ten hands-on classes that cover a range of topics in energy efficiency, renewable energy and heating options, and learn about relevant incentives and financing. Transportation, local food, and waste reduction are also covered. Following the training, volunteers commit to helping at least two other community members reduce their energy use by taking steps that are important to them.

In 2016, over a dozen Energy Navigators supported over 80 friends, family members, colleagues, and contacts from their faith organizations with actions that together will help them save over \$100,000 and reduce their collective carbon emissions by over 350 tons. Here are some things participants have said about the program:
