## Enfield Summer Camp and the Youth Paddling Club

Late Fall the Enfield Community Council was awarded \$2500 from the Youth Philanthropy Grant for the "Enfield Youth Paddling Club."

During the 2016 ECC Summer Camp season our Science Specialist Colleen McKenzie, Rural Youth Services Teen Program Manager Eric Carter, camp staff, and a community volunteer took six youth on a two hour canoe trip as a first-time experience for the campers and the camp itself. It was a success and from there the Youth Paddling Club evolved.

The intention is to offer five to six trips during the summer camp season to campers 9-13 years of age. The next endeavor is to branch out to offer the Paddling Club to Enfield youth in the early Fall and late Spring as canoe trips and/or outdoor Education/Conservation clubs and some family outings.

The vision for the Enfield Youth Paddling Club is to get youth involved in the outdoors for recreational and educational/environmental purposes. Too many youth these days are focused on indoor activities and not exploring the surrounding environment. The goal of the Paddling Club is to branch out and coordinate some volunteer work with local environmental groups to do projects/research on bird counts and water samples.

So far the Enfield Youth Paddling Club has three canoes, nine paddles, 8 life vests, first aide kits, water-tight bags/carriers, twenty-five "Enfield Youth Paddling Club" baseball caps, and a storage bin for all supplies. The goal is to use the remaining funds to purchase binoculars, aluminum nets, and field guide books on plants, birds, trees, and amphibians/reptiles.

I would like to thank all the teens who participated in the United Way Youth Philanthropy Granting process and for awarding the funds for this community project. I would also like to congratulate the three Enfield teens (Renee, Morgan and Avery) who participated in Youth Philanthropy— quite an experience— Bravo!!

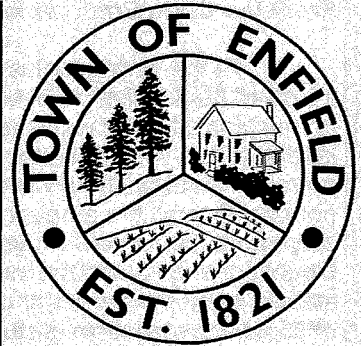

## Report from the Supervisor

We're halfway through the year...with a 10 day tour of the Danube a wonderful memory, the weeds three feet high when I got back and still not under control...and only 1/8th of the necessary Town work done.

With Henry Hansteen's resignation, in April, we welcomed a new board member, Becky Sims, Black Oak Road. Becky brings a lot of energy and knowledge to this position. Her thoughtfulness, word processing skills and research abilities are welcome additions to the board.

In March, the Planning Board reviewed the site plans of the Delaware River Solar project that is proposed on Podunk Road, requested they comply with County Planning recommendations on minimum cutting of trees on the acreage complete, and determined that this project was not on prime farming land and approved the site plans of this project. In May, the project entered into Payment in Lieu of Taxes agreement with the Tompkins County Industrial Development Agency.

Last July the Planning Board approved the site plans for Mecklenburg Solar LLC. In May, the IDA also entered into a PILOT agreement with this project.

Each of these parcels of land currently pays the Town of Enfield \$250/year. After the Delaware River project comes on line, it will pay the Town \$4076/year. Each year thereafter they will pay 2% more each year until reaching full assessment after 20 years. My math says this is \$7569.00 more in taxes that the Town will get from these 2 parcels now. I see this as a win for Enfield.

At the June meeting, a 1 year moratorium on Commercial Wind and Solar Energy Facilities was passed by the board. This will not affect permitted projects, such as the 2 mentioned above, or alternative energy projects that are for agricultural use but, since the Black Oak Wind Farm has not gotten through the Town Board permitting process, it will be affected since the moratorium specifically stops all Town Board plan reviews. Members of the Board say this will give us time to develop a Solar Law and time to rewrite the Wind Law to be more in line with current technologies and current health concerns.

Virginia and I are updating the Town's Policies and Procedures Manual. Its been awhile and many things have changed.

It's been a hard spring for us gardeners and our farming neighbors, what with all the rain. I was so impressed with the flurry of work right after Memorial Day. There must have been many long hour dyas, including Saturdays and Sundays, to get that vast amount of acreage planted in those few short days. However, it does look like much of the corn will be "knee high by the 4th of July." Enjoy the Summer!

### From the Code Enforcement Officer

At the writing of this the town has issued a total of 69 building permits, including 5 new homes and 11 solar installations. This is down a little from last year when we issued a total of 79 permits including 10 new homes and 22 solar permits. Overall the amount of permits seems to stay about the same from year to year with the biggest change being the increase in solar installations over the last three years with a total of 55 solar installations including the solar farms located on Mecklenburg Road.

Another topic I like to bring up this time of year is heating systems. Although we are already well into the heating season, if you haven't already you should have your heating system inspected/serviced. This should be done annually for all systems and more frequently if you are heating with a solid fuel including wood, coal or pellets.

Lastly I like to remind folks to check their smoke and CO detectors for proper operation and fresh batteries if needed. I believe soon the only detectors available under the new building code will come with a ten year non replaceable battery, which eliminates the need to change batteries, but will also mean that after the ten years you will need to replace the detectors, which is the recommended life of the detectors. If you have any questions regarding the number, type or required placement of detectors feel free to give me a call and I will tell you the specific requirements.

As always stay safe and warm this winter.

Did You Know History of Enfield?  
Sue Thompson, Enfield Town Historian

DISTRICT #7-(WOODARD) located northeast corner Woodard and Hines Roads. Appears on the 1866 map of this location.

On Saturday, 24, 1957, Woodard School celebrated Martha Bock Day. Martha Bock was the last schoolteacher to teach at Woodard School. The celebration was because of the Ithaca School District consolidation plans closing Woodard School.

A large cake was prepared by Mrs. Elizabeth McFall, Mrs. Dorothy Gordon and Mrs. Andrew Krayniak, decorated by Mrs. Alma Bock (Martha's sister-in-law). The cake was a replica of the schoolhouse.

The school "Hand Bell" which belonged to her grandmother, was gold plated and engraved as a gift to Martha. Lee Rumsey, one of her first pupils, was Master of Ceremonies for the day. Lawrence Eckler of Niagara Falls, represented the middle generation, which she taught.

## Highway Department Report:

I thought I would start by telling you a little bit about what your Highway takes care of. There are five full time crew members, and myself, taking care of total of eighty-six lane miles of road, drive way pipes, ditches, three Bridges, and road side mowing. One hundred forty-eight road crossing pipes plus the delineators/markers. We have and maintain at crossing pipes plus the delineators/markers. We have and maintain at least two hundred sixty-four signs and posts. Service and repair Twenty-Three major pieces of equipment, for instance ten-wheel dump trucks, back hoe, loader, etc. all maintenance occurs in house and most repairs. As well as many more miscellaneous items.

We purchased a used 2004 Gradall Excavator at auction for \$14,000 with 2,700 hours. Which at today market value is a \$30-50,000 piece of equipment. This was a great deal for Enfield and will eventually replace the 1998 excavator with 9,000 hours.

We are a little behind on our summer projects because of the rain, these projects are South Van Dorn Road and North Van Dorn Road.

This is a good time to be looking at your mailbox. Your mailbox including support arm should have a minimum clearance of 42-48" (ideally 46") above the Roadside. The front of the mailbox should not extend beyond the edge of the shoulder. The mailbox post should be a minimum of 18" from the edge of the shoulder. This is our Enfield policy and guidelines which can also be found on the Web.

Just for information: all the work we do, we do to make everyone's travel safe, whether it is cutting trees for visibility, digging ditches to keep water off the roads, etc all this is for safety and some because of highway laws.

The board of elections contacted us, needing a new Enfield site for the 2017 elections will be held at the Enfield Town Highway Barns, located at Enfield 475 Main Road.

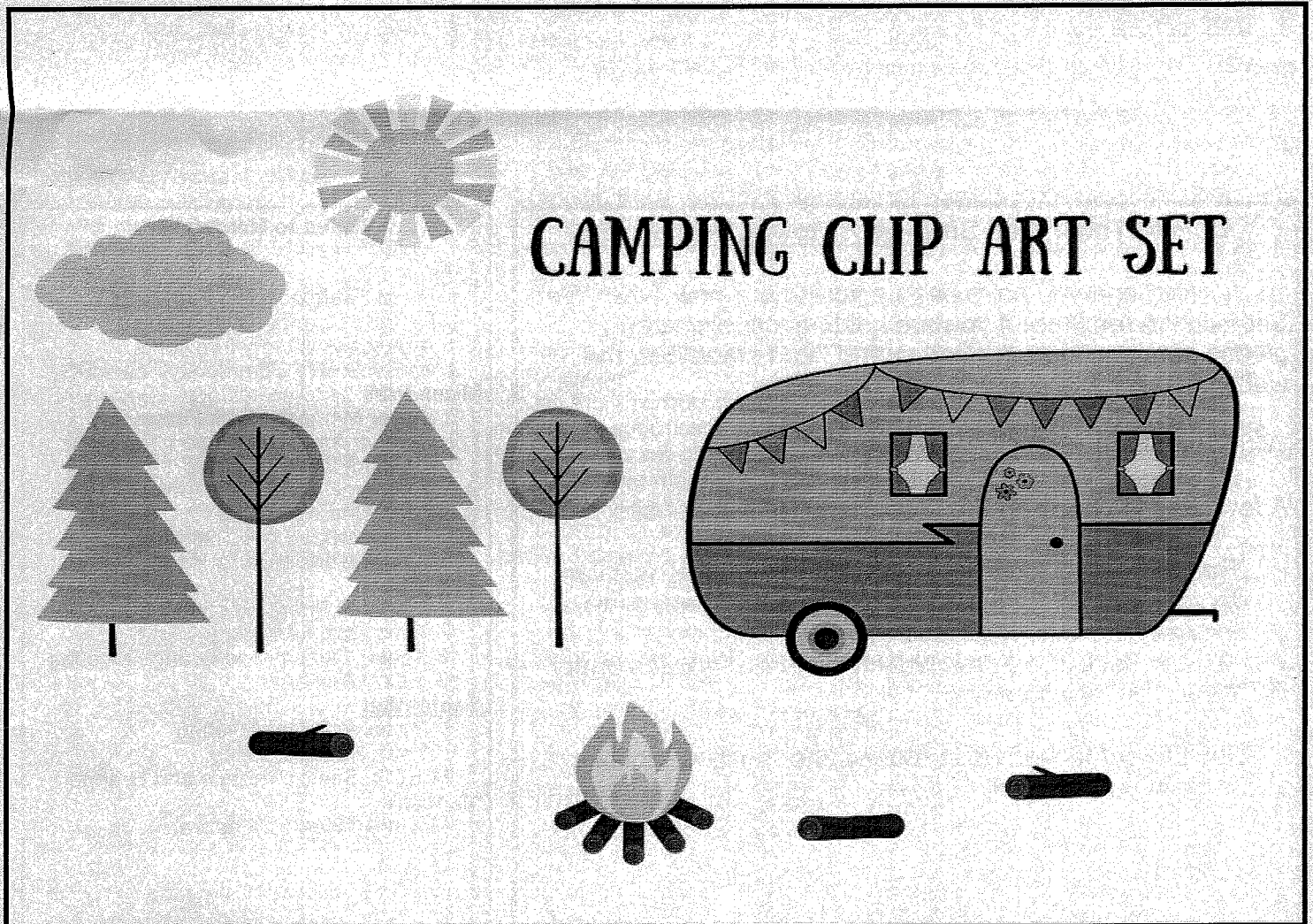
